August 17, 1952, Mobile Construction Battalion Six completed their deployment in Argentia, Newfoundland, and boarded the USS Kent for their return voyage to Davisville, Rhode Island. The battalion arrived in Davisville on August 22, 1952. The two-party leave period was used while the battalion was in the States in order to allow the men leave, and at the same time, send others to schools in Newport, R. I. By October 5, 1952, all hands were aboard, making ready for their next deployment which was to be Cuba. On October 10, the battalion went aboard the MSTS Muir and sailed for Guantanamo Bay, arriving there on Oct. 15, 1952. The Battalion immediately moved into barracks at Leeward Point, where they stayed until April 3, 1953. "Six" had many jobs (as usual) on this deployment and some of them were: completing the runway lighting; extending the boundary road; drilling for water; building a new sickbay; and construction of living quarters for the Naval Air Station.

The Battalion returned to the States shortly after Easter 1953, for leave and recreation. The same two-party leave period was used so that the men could attend schools. The Battalion, as always, was very busy making ready for their next deployment.

When May 23, 1953, rolled around, "Six" climbed aboard the USS Sanborne and set sail for Port Lyautey, French Morocco. They arrived on June 2nd and commenced work shortly after on many various projects. Among some of the jobs included the finishing of a new gymnasium; construction of a new out-door movie; remodeling of a large airplane hangar; maintenance work on the dependents housing; and the building of a new LST ramp.


Early in November, MCB Six left Port Lyautey for Davisville, arriving on November 15th. Plans were put into effect for "Six" to be split into nine detachments. The Battalion picked up stakes on February 8, 1954, and departed for Cuba, where the plan was to take shape. "Six" arrived in sunny Cuba on February 13, 1954. As final plans were being put together for the detachments, MCB Six aided MCB Eight, who was deployed in Cuba at that time, on the construction of the dependents housing project.

Detachment "Dog" was the first of the detachments to be commissioned, with R. F. Reynolds, CWO, USN, as its officer-in-charge. "Dog" left Cuba on 16 April '54, on the LST 988, arriving in San Juan on 18 April. The detachment remained there until November of 1954, before returning to Davisville, R. I.

The second of the detachments, "Easy," was commissioned on 7 May '54, and departed aboard the LST 988 for San Salvadore in the Bahama Islands on 21 May. Ensign C. Matthews, CEC, USN, was officer-in-charge, and WO W. Monnier, USN, assistant officer-in-charge. Detachment "Easy" returned to Davisville the following year on 27 August 1955.

It is at this point that this cruise book begins with the commissioning of detachment "Fox" . . .





The big day for Detachment "Fox" came on June 5, 1954, in Cuba, where the Detachment was commissioned in a short and colorful ceremony, headed by CDR P. J. Simmons, commanding officer of MCB Six and LCDR A. L. Pekarsky, executive officer. CDR Simmons read the official orders which officially commissioned Detachment "Fox," with LTJG C. W. Harman as officer-in-charge, and CHELEC R. P. Wittenberg as assistant officer-in-charge.


Following the personnel inspection, CDR Simmons addressed the Detachment, emphasizing the importance of the work to be done and its significance in the large-scale planning of the Navy Department and the Department of Defense. LTJG Harman accepted the command of "Fox," expressing his confidence in the ability and loyalty of the Detachment, and assured CDR Simmons that "Fox" would faithfully perform the duty assigned her.

Detachment "Fox," composed of 148-men, departed on the LST 533, on June 14, 1954, for Grand Turk. The Detachment was officially decommissioned in July 1955, at Davisville, Rhode Island.





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In July of 1954, MCB Six returned to Davisville from Cuba, and made the necessary arrangements for the commissioning of Detachment "George," which was commissioned on July 9, 1954. The new Detachment was led by LT J. Morgan, CEC, USN, and ENS A. L. Brown, CEC, USNR, as assistant OinC. Detachment "George" departed for Nova Scotia, where they stayed until August 1955, at which time they returned to Davisville, and were decommissioned.


On September 3, 1954, Detachment "How," the Fifth Detachment, was commissioned with LT A. E. Hackett, CEC, USN, as officer-in-charge and ENS J. A. Tiso, CEC, USNR, assistant OinC. The 140-man-Detachment was commissioned in front of Barracks 107, in Davisville, with LCDR A. L. Pekarsky, CEC, USNR, executive officer of MCB Six, reading the official orders. Detachment "How" departed Davisville on September 14, 1954, aboard the LST 532. They spent eight months on tropical Bermuda before returning on the LST 344, to be decommissioned in June of 1955.

CHANGE OF COMMAND



October 27, 1954, MCB Six, for the second time in its history, held a change of command ceremony with LCDR R. C. Jaquess, CEC, USNR, assuming command from CDR P. J. Simmons, CEC, USN, in a short but stirring ceremony. Captain Short and CDR Doyle, of CBLANT, were also on hand for the official ceremony, which was held in the CBC Gymnasium.

CDR P. J. Simmons, after reading his orders, expressed his pride in having been commanding officer of the Battalion, and in the cooperation and support he had received from the officers and men of "Six." Even though his tour with the Battalion was only 17 months, he was well aware of the excellent work that the Battalion had done and he knew that MCB Six would continue to uphold the high standard of work previously done on their projects.

LCDR Jaquess stated that he was proud to be the new commanding officer of MCB Six, and that he hoped the men would show the same spirit of willingness, cooperation and loyalty with him, as they had with CDR Simmons.



Detachment Item




Three months passed before the next Detachment was commissioned. It was on 21 January 1955, that the men of MCB Six formed the sixth detachment—Detachment "Item." The new commanding officer of MCB Six, CDR Jaquess, read the official orders commissioning Detachment "Item." LTJG J. A. Lane, CEC, USNR, then read his orders which gave him the helm as officer-in-charge. Following the commissioning ceremony was a personnel inspection held by CDR Jaquess, LCDR Pekarsky, and LTJG Lane.

The commissioning of Detachment "Jig" came on 20 April 1955, with LTJG H. N. Wenke, CEC, USNR, as officer-in-charge and ENS W. A. Baker, CEC, USNR, assistant OinC.


MCB Six's commanding officer, CDR R. C. Jaquess read the orders forming the 140-men as a Detachment.

LTJG Wenke, in a short speech accepting the command of the Detachment, expressed his pride in the confidence that had been placed in him, and in the Detachment. "With everyone's cooperative work on this project," he said, "I am sure we will be able to complete the job in 'jig' time."







Detachment "Love" was commissioned on July 11th, 1955 at 1330, in an impressive ceremony held in Davisville. LCDR L. Pyles read the orders for the commissioning of Detachment "Love" and her new officer-in-charge, ENS S. T. Wilkoz. Detachment "Love" departed Davisville in July 1955, and was deployed at Cape May, New Jersey. The Detachment returned to the States a few months later in October and was decommissioned.

ANTIGUA



The First Lift had a hard, but important job to do when they arrived. They had to put several refres in operation so that the frozen food could be stored. This job had to be completed during the first week because the ship carrying the Battalion's first food supply was due one week after their arrival. Other important jobs were the tent camp area (which had to be ready for the second Lift which arrived two weeks later), and the boundary fence. Two old buildings were located on the camp site and they were an old salt water pump house, and one wing of an old army hospital. The utilities included a sewer system, a salt water system and part of a fresh water system.

These two buildings proved to be a big help in the early days of the deployment. Without too much work, the old hospital wing was turned into a temporary galley, mess hall and personnel office. Later, the old army hospital wing was remodeled and served as a galley, mess hall, personnel office, offices for the commanding officer

In September 1955, with Detachment Item, Detachment Jig, and Detachment Love still operating, the main body of the Battalion prepared to take on another job in Antigua, B.W.I. The Battalion left Davisville in three lifts, with the first lift leaving on September 21, and arriving in Antigua on the 29th, after stopping for a short while on Grand Turk to unload materials there.

Lift Two departed Davisville on the 29th of September, arriving at Antigua on Oct. 8th. The Third Lift left on Oct. 15, arriving on the 23rd.



As time passed, the construction of the new naval facility started and before long, buildings began popping up all over the area.


Off hours were spent on the many white sandy beaches on the island, recreation parties, movies, sports, writing letters, studying and patronizing the Seabee beer hall.





During an informal ceremony on September 18, 1956, in Davisville, R.I., Det. LIMA was commissioned with LT G. A. Anderson, CEC, USN, as OinC and LTJG F. M. Kresser, CEC, USNR, as assistant OinC.

The detachment of 200 men, departed the following day for Roosevelt Roads, P.R., where they stayed for six months before returning to the main body of MCB Six in Davisville, in March 1957.

"LIMA" had many jobs to perform while deployed in Puerto Rico, but the most important was the renovation of the dependent housing for the expanding naval base there.

Their high morale and "Can Do" spirit was shown in many ways during their stay in Puerto Rico. One of the biggest factors behind this tiny group was their newspaper, the "Det. LIMA Limb."








MCB Six moved out of Davisville for sunny Cuba on Sept. 28, 1956, on the LST 1163. The Battalion arrived on Oct. 3, and quickly went to work unloading and moving into the CB camp area on mainside.

The Battalion was loaded down with many jobs and some of these were: raising the athletic field, relocating and building a new road section to eliminate serious driving hazards; and the largest of the projects, construction of 88 married enlisted quarters and 25 married officers' quarters at Leeward Point. This job alone was too large for the Battalion to complete on this cruise, as no adequate housing was available for the Battalion at Leeward Point.


Shortly after the Battalion arrived in GTMO, the command of MCB Six changed hands when CDR V. M. Tregonis, CEC, USN, relieved CDR R. C. Jaquess, CEC, USNR, in a very impressive ceremony. Oct. 27, 1956, marked the fourth time the command had changed hands.

Other interesting facts on this deployment were in the sports field. MCB Six ended the base softball league in 4th place with M. R. Schack taking the batting title with a .500 average. In bowling, the Seabees came out second in the league with a $70\frac{1}{2}$ — $17\frac{1}{2}$ win-loss record. Individual trophies were awarded to the Bees, with a large trophy for the Battalion. Wexell had the leagues best average with a 181.3 and walked off with a fine trophy. The basketball team finished the season in 4th place in the base league.










