

because,—working through long hours of rain and mud and dust and heat, they have set up, on foreign soil, a unit for service to the fighting men of the Navy,


because,—they have worked and played together in the common cause of getting a job done, and finally,

TROPICAL BEACH



ESPIRITU SANTO

In the New Hebrides, or the Great Cyclades group of islands, lies the island of Espiritu Santo, the largest of the group. Volcanic by origin, the islands have been girdled and embellished by myriapoda (worm shaped animals with many joints and legs) so that they are barricaded with reefs of many forms and gorgeous hues. Besides having the highest point above sea level, 5520 feet, Santo also has the most important rivers in the island group, namely the Sarakata, the Renee and the Jordan. The interior of this picturesque island can be penetrated for many miles along these rivers where scenes of unrivalled beauty are unveiled. Tropical vegetation is everywhere, even clinging to the mountain sides. The dense sombre forests, where grow rosewood, ebony, kaori, sandalwood, gum-trees, banyans and bamboo, are pierced only by the rows of coconut and palm trees. Also abounding here are many useful plants such as juicy tropical creepers which, like the bamboo, furnish excellent refreshment. Berries similar to wild figs, areca and various native tubers which give valuable relief to those lost in the jungle also grow here. On the other hand, among many useful plants, grow many poisonous plants and species of cruel nettle which are very harmful. To the unfamiliar person, the jungle is never a safe place to go.

Except for the bird life, there exists no wild life on Santo. Beautiful birds, pigeons, turtle-doves, gorgeously plumaged parakeets, sparrows, bats and seabirds abound here and their screechings echo and re-echo through the jungle. Wild boar has been introduced in recent years and traces of alligators and snakes have recently come to light which proves that they no doubt do exist in isolated sections. Deposits of chromium, small amounts of gold, sulphur, nickle, cobalt, copper and iron have been found but due to the tremendous transportation difficulties, they

have never been developed.

The climate is tropical, tempered by the trade winds. The nights are generally fresh and tolerable, and the rains abundant with many and frequent cyclones. The principal obstacle to white people in this country is malaria, which reigns supreme throughout the New Hebrides.

HISTORY OF SANTO

The archipelago was discovered in 1606 by Quiros, a Spanish navigator, and Lt. De Torres. They landed on a Whit Sunday and took possession in the name of the King of Spain, baptising it Espiritu Santo (Holy Spirit) as a souvenir of the date of discovery. After several months on the islands, sickness and dissensions among the crew made them depart. In 1768, Bougainville visited the island and proved that contrary to the belief of Quiros, Santo was an island and not the Australian Continent. Six years later Capt. Cook landed, and in 1793, Capt. Bligh visited the island. In 1848, French missionaries founded an establishment on the island but the hostility of the natives made it necessary for them to leave. Previous to the missionaries, whalers had been putting in to the island but they had built fortified bases at their mooring places to defend themselves against the natives. In 1885, the French officially took possession, establishing military posts. At the request of Australia, England protested the French possession and after many lengthy conferences, the two nations established their conjoint sovereignty over the archipelago. This was on October 24, 1887. A naval commission drawn from both countries is responsible for the administration of the islands and have policed it since the Condominion Government constitution was drawn up in 1902. The currency of both countries is legal tender in the New Hebrides.

THE NATIVES

The native population is of Melanesian (Papuan) origin, more or less modified by Polynesian strains. Polynesians invaded the islands at times and massacred the aboriginal population only to be massacred themselves later on. The natives with Polynesian blood in their veins are on the whole intelligent, more civilized and more industrious than their darker skinned brothers. The Melanesians are an inferior specimen of humanity, of medium stature, belligerent and still in the practice of cannibalism. They separate themselves fiercely from the white people and resent the intrusion of the white and his custom. The male considers the woman in the same category as beasts of burden and has undisputed authority over her. Poly-

gamy is general except in those tribes which have yielded to the influence of missionaries. Native custom rules that on her husband's death, a woman follows him to the tomb by hanging. The children are rather neglected and kept in a deplorably unhygienic condition among the Melanesian tribes, but on the contrary affectionately considered and treated where the Polynesian blood dominates.

The religion of the native population is a kind of witchcraft practised by the tribal sorcerer who has great influence, second only to the Great War Chief. They

believe in devils and are fearful of roaming at night.

The native diet is mainly vegetarian with fish and a small amount of pork. The food is cooked in taro or banana leaves on stones previously made white hot. These white hot stones are also used for their refined forms of torture. To make an adulterous woman lose her appetite for sin, an application of these stones is made to the guilty part. To ensure against the running away of a fugitive, the stones are applied to the bend of the leg behind the knee. Tied securely with creepers the stone is left to do its cruel job of destroying the muscle.

One of the favourite distractions of the natives is dancing. Accompanied by the tireless tom-tom, they dance often and with great enthusiasm which carries them through hours and hours of the sombre tropical night. Other pastimes of the natives are fishing, with assegai or bow and arrow, at which they are remarkably clever, and long evening palavers by the fireside in their huts—long tales that never end and which make them burst out in childish laughter from time to time.

The men living on the sea coast are known as "man sallwatta" (men of salt water); the men living in the interior or in the mountains are called "manbush" (men of the bush). Manbush is also an expression meaning a person is a fool, because the people of the interior are even more primitive than those living on the coast. The manbush is also the more ferocious of the two and more often than not, they are at war with each other. They very seldom mix together or fraternize.

LABOR

In the New Hebrides, labor has always been one of the difficult procuring tasks of the plantation owners. He is always in need of workmen and has been recruiting labor by one means or another. Usually this recruiting is carried on in a peaceful manner but often the poor simple blacks were signed up as a result of clever tactics and ruses used by the owner. A native usually is signed up for a "sikis monis" (six month) or "one yam" (one year) period. He receives from four to eight dollars a month in cash, a stick of tobacco every Saturday and daily rations of

rice, tea, bread, meat and sugar. Even with his Kanaka help, not enough labor was available, so the French colonists appealed to their government for permission to recruit labor in French Indo-China. The Tonkinese are recruited in Tonkin by the French administration and placed at the disposal of the colonists. Their whole future existence is governed by a hiring contract which prearranges wages, deferred pay, clothing, food, medical care, repatriation and reengagement, all precisely regulated. The black and yellow labourers live peaceably together, and incidents are rare and then slight. The black lives apart in his leafy village, while the Tonkinese live in fibre or corrugated iron huts.

NATIVE LANGUAGE


The natives of course have their own form of language, which is a very primitive form of speech. With the exception of a few missionaries and planters, the Europeans never got to know their language, the reason being that totally different languages are spoken from island to island. Even in certain of the larger ones different languages are spoken by the various tribes.

To converse with the white man, a language has been evolved called in English "pidgin English". It varies but slightly according to the island groups. Most of the words are of English origin, with a few French and even Spanish words. The forms of speech are very primitive and the whole vocabulary has but few words, the same word having different meanings according to the way they are used. An example, to say "my child has gone fishing" in pidgin English, would be "Piccaninny blong me he finis go cassem fiss". The word "finis" is always used to express that the thing has been done or is in the course of execution; the word "bimebie" (bye and bye) is used to express the future and when a native says "bimebie", he usually attaches no true conception to it and might just as easily mean later, tomorrow, next week, next year or beyond that. Just "bimebie".

The mode of expression is at times very funny. As in the case when a native had gone to gather manure for the garden and had been asked why he had been away so long, he replied, "Masta, me finis go get him dung blong bullumoocow". All cattle are known as "bullumoocow". When a native had seen a piano for the first time, he expressed himself thusly to his friend, "Bokiss him he got teeth him he white teeth him he black; white Mary him he fight him teeth and bokiss him he makkem plenty good fallah noise". Translated, he meant, "Box which has white and black teeth; the white lady bangs the teeth and the box make good fellow noise".

The war has upset all this way of life on these tropical islands. It is indeed a spectacle of bitter irony to see the most civilized among the white people coming to the most uncivilized of blacks to annihilate the wicked work of other supposedly "civilized" people. When the little men that hissed through buck-teeth, started edging down the Pacific, their shadow was cast over Santo. It was not until the last refugees had left the Solomons and the outpost of Tulagi was gone that any Americans landed here. In May, 1942, a little band of 400 soldiers landed to build and hold an air strip, come what may. Native help was recruited, among them almost 100 bonafide cannibals. The feverish band worked and slaved and 17 days after the first coconut trees had been cleared, six B17's landed on the strip. Gunfire was heard on Santo, but the yellow threat was dispersed after the terrific naval encounter of the Coral Sea.

The war is not yet over for Santo, but someday when the cannons' roar is forgotten and peace again reigns over the world, this little island too will slip away once more and become that tranquil, romantic spot in the world of the land down under.











The life we lived . . what we used to be


Faces still young . . on pages long faded yellow.
