TASK ORGANIZATION: U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ONE

1. SITUATION. In accordance with reference (a), the Battalion is undergoing a training and reorganizational period. As part of this training, the Battalion will conduct training in individual combat and military tactics at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina under the following conditions.

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# ANNEX B LOGISTICS AND EQUIPMENT

- 1. <u>Procedures</u>. Standard operational procedures set forth by reference (b) will be followed.
- 2. <u>Funding</u>. The Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Construction Battalion Center, Davisville, Rhode Island is the official accounting agent for all funds assigned the Atlantic Naval Construction Force. COMCBLANT will provide (O&MN) funds quarterly for the administrative support of the Battalion. O&MN funds will be provided in the form of an Operating Target (OPTAR).

- 4. The USN equipment required for this training is located at Camp Lejeune in the custody of the Base Motor Transport Officer whose telephone number is 7-3134 or 7-5736. The equipment can be drawn from the Base Motor Transport Officer on Form DD 1150, signed by the Battalion C.O. or his representative. Upon completion of the field training at Camp Lejeune, the equipment will be transferred back to the Base Motor Transport Officer utilizing Form DD 1150 and signed for by the Base Motor Transport Officer or his representative. A copy of the executed transfer of custody for each piece of USN equipment will be forwarded to the 21st NCR. At the time of transfer, a complete Shop Repair Order (NAVDOCKS 1948) will be submitted with each piece of equipment, showing parts required (manufacturers' part number) and work necessary to place equipment in E-1 condition. A copy of the Shop Repair Orders will be forwarded to Code R60 of the 21st NCR. Reference (e) sets forth the requirements for control and management reporting of the equipment assignment.
- 5. During the training deployment and while the equipment is being utilized by the Battalion, the Battalion will be responsible for all maintenance and minor repairs required to maintain the equipment in E-1 condition, which will be funded from Battalion OPTAR.

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- 6. Equipment requiring major repairs will be turned in to the Camp Lejeune Base Motor Transport Officer who will effect such repairs as may be necessary.
- 7. In accordance with reference (e), the 512 Report on all USN equipment will be completed and forwarded to the 21st NCR CODE R60 within five (5) days after the return of the Battalion to CBC, Davisville.
- 8. The Dispatchers Log, DD 1359, will be maintained on a daily basis and all logs will be submitted to the 21st NCR Equipment Officer upon completion of the training at Camp Lejeune.

### 9. Logistics Support

- a. <u>Subsistence</u>. Berthing and Messing facilities will be provided by the Marine Corps Base.
- b. <u>Supplies</u>. Administrative and operational supplies shall be procured from the Marine Corps Base. The Battalion will provide appropriation data to the Marine Corps Accounting Office, Building 1005, for issuance of the supplies. There is a Serv-Mart located at the Marine Corps Base which carries a wide range of supplies.
- (1) Combat Rations. Combat rations will be utilized for meals where it will be impracticable for the Battalion to subsist at a mess hall. Combat rations needed will be estimated for the Battalion and ordered in sufficient time to permit delivery to Camp Lejeune prior to the arrival of the Battalion. Combat rations will be ordered from NSC, Norfolk, Virginia for delivery to Camp Lejeune. Combat rations not utilized by the Battalion will be turned over to the next battalion or put in the custody of the Base Property Control Officer, Marine Corps Base.

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# ANNEX C PUBLIC AFFAIRS

1. <u>MISSION</u>. Collect and disseminate public affairs material that will illustrate the defensive, military posture and smartness of today's Seabees.

#### 2. EXECUTION

- a. The release of public affairs material in connection with the deployment shall be in accordance with references (f) and (g).

- (3) Do not contain any material which tends to degrade or ridicule the customs or living conditions of the area where employed.
- c. News releases will be made only through the operational/area Commander.
