Access: The records had an initial Declassification Review with some records being referred to other agencies for further review. However, in accordance with the Navy's "Declassification Review Policy" the records must also have a Kyl-Lott Review before they may be open to the public.

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Scope and Content Note

The Rear Admiral Powell Collection contains papers dealing with his diary, correspondence, and orders; official subject files; unofficial subject files; and miscellaneous publications. These are the four series in the original arrangement done by Mae C. Seaton in April 1964.

Biography of Rear Admiral Paulus P. Powell

Rear Admiral Powell was born at Woodview, Virginia, on 25 April 1892. He attended the Naval Academy, graduated and was commissioned an Ensign in 1913. He subsequently progressed in grade until his appointment to Commodore on 20 October 1944. Commodore Powell was transferred to the Retired List of the U.S. Navy on 1 January 1947 with the rank of Rear Admiral.

After graduation from the Academy he was assigned to USS *Delaware* and served in that battleship in Mexican waters until May 1917 when he was transferred to USS *Illinois*. He then served in USS *New Mexico* and in March 1919 was transferred to USS *McKean* as the ship's Executive Officer. His next duty assignment was as Executive Officer of USS *Graham* in March 1920. In August 1920 he was transferred to duty in USS *Gilmer*, operating in the Black Sea, Mediterranean and Adriatic Sea.

Following sea duty, Rear Admiral Powell had several years of shore duty in Washington, D.C. and on the staff of the Commander Naval Forces, Europe, from June 1923 to October 1925. In November 1926 he assumed command of USS *Scorpion*, the station ship in Constantinople, flying the flag of Rear Admiral Mark L. Bristol, High Commissioner to Turkey. Following his duty with *Scorpion* he returned to shore duty in Washington, D.C. until May 1929. In May 1929 he was assigned as Navigator onboard USS *Richmond* and then returned to Washington, D.C. in June 1932 for two more years of shore duty.

From August 1934 to March 1935 he served as Operations Officer on the staff of Commander-in-Chief, Asiatic Fleet and then assumed command of Destroyer Division Fifteen until July 1936. He attended the Naval War College next and then was assigned duty as a member of the U.S. Naval Mission, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, from July 1937 until September 1939.

Rear Admiral Powell returned to sea aboard USS *Arizona* as Executive Officer until May 1940 when he assumed command of USS *Omaha* from June 1940 to October 1941. He returned to Washington, D.C. for duty from October 1941 to June 1942. From June 1942 to November 1943 he commanded USS *Mount Vernon*. In November he reported as Chief of Staff and aide to Commander, Third Amphibious Force and served in that assignment until relieved of all active duty pending retirement. He was transferred to the Retired List on 1 January 1947.

ARTIFACTS AND BOOKS

Artifacts and books from the Paulus P. Powell Collection are held by the Naval History and Heritage Command's Curator Branch and Navy Department Library.

Note regarding artifact: This paper collection had a small artifact box that contained two spark plugs with covers. After consulting with the command's Head, Curator Branch, Mr. Frank Thompson, on 20 June 2010, he determined the spark plug artifacts were not of historical value/significance and were removed from the collection and destroyed.
