III. OPERATIONS

The beginning of the new year found the Bear Aces of VAW-124 preparing to resume an ambitious workup cycle with Carrier Air Wing EIGHT and NIMITZ. Most of the month of January was spent in the GITMO operating area south of Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The last four days of the month were spent on a port visit in Port Everglades (FT. Lauderdale) Florida.

Most of February and the first week of March were spent completing the preparation for an extended overseas deployment. NIMITZ and VAW-124 said goodby to Norfolk on 8 March and immediately prepared for the ensuing Readiness Exercise and ORE. During the ORE the Bear Aces furnished the Battle Group Commander with 'Round the Clock' Airborne Early Warning, Strike, and CAP Control, and Command and Control for 72 hours.

The first half of April was spent on a Central American Swing and then translant. NIMITZ and CVW-8 operated off the coast of Nicaragua and Panama for 5 days on a "show the flag/show of force" mission. Most of the translant was spent "Getting up on the Step" for the higher tempo of operations that would greet us once we came under the operational control of Commander Battle Force, Sixth Fleet.

The turnover was completed with VAW-121 and the EISENHOWER Battle Group on 23 April. From there NIMITZ and VAW-124 made for port at Toulon, France, the heart of the French Riviera.

Shortly after the Toulon port visit, NIMITZ and CVW-8 participated in the NATO Exercise "Distant Hammer". VAW-124 provided Airborne Early Warning for the Battle Group Commander, Dissimilar Air Combat Training Control for the "Jolly Rogers" of VF-84 and "Black Aces" of VF-41, against French, Italian, and Turkish Air Force aircraft as well as overland strike coordination for the "Black Panthers" of VA-35, "Marauders" of VA-82, and the "Sidewinders" of VA-86. At the completion of this extremely successful and highly visible exercise was a reward. NIMITZ and the Bear Aces were granted a port call in Haifa, Israel. During this seven day port visit command of the Bear Aces was transferred from CDR Robert Engle to CDR Roy Russell. The last 5 days in May were spent off the coast of Lebanon and Syria running cyclic flight operations.

NIMITZ and CVW-8 headed west to participate in the joint US-Spanish exercise "Poop Deck 1-85". During this two day exercise the Bear Aces once again provided timely and accurate AEW, overland Strike Control, CAP and Vector Logic Grid Control. At the completion of this exercise NIMITZ made for another port call, Livorno, Italy.

Only twelve hours prior to dropping anchor in Livorno, NIMITZ received an urgent message to take up a station off of Beirut in response to the TWA Flight 847 hijacking. During the transit to "BENO" Station, VAW-124 Hawkeyes launched to facilitate tracking of the TWA 727 as it crisscrossed the MED between Algiers and Beirut. Once established on "BENO" Station in the Eastern MED the Bear Aces prepared for what was to be a 45 day stay in the MODLOC position off of Beirut.

July saw tensions ease, the release of all of the hostages and a "Beer Day" on NIMITZ. Excitement arose even at the news of a possible port visit in Alexandria, Egypt.

August started off with a 3 day visit to Alexandria, Egypt. The conclusion of that visit started the joint US-Egyption exercise "Bright Star". Again VAW-124 was at the center of operations. In addition to providing overland Strike Control, Dissimilar Air Combat Training (DACT) Control, and Airborne Early Warning and Command and Control, the Bear Aces were involved in the detecting, tracking, and controlling of intercepts on forward deployed Soviet Reconnaissance aircraft. The last week of August was spent in port Naples, Italy.

September saw a 5 day port call in the island paradise of Palma De Mallorca, Spain, and the much awaited turnover with VAW-125 and the SARATOGA Battle Group. Immediately following the turnover however, instead of proceeding to Naples for a short 3 day port visit, NIMITZ and CVW-8 were ordered once again to take station off of Lebanon. After spending 9 days there NIMITZ, CVW-8, and VAW-124 were finally ordered home.

On 3 October VAW-124's 4 E-2C's flew off NIMITZ and returned to eagerly awaiting family and friends at NAS Norfolk. The following day, NIMITZ returned to pier 12 amidst the cheers of anxiously waiting family and friends.

During the last 3 months of 1985 the Bear Aces sent 2 plane detachments to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and Corpus Christi, Texas in support of the Vice Presidential Drug Interdiction Program. While in Guantanamo Bay, VAW-124 Hawkeyes worked in conjunction with U.S. Customs Service aircraft and located and siezed 1 aircraft with 700 pounds of cocaine. The Corpus Christi Det was equally as successful; 430 pounds of marijuana, 1 aircraft, and 3 individuals were taken into custody.
