BEAR ACE HISTORY UPDATE 1990

The "Bear Aces" of VAW-124 began 1990 in their homeport of NAS Norfolk, VA. The Bear Aces were tasked for the initial Shakedown Cruise of the Navy's newest carrier USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN-72). After almost a month at sea, the USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN-72) pulled into FT. Lauderdale, Florida on 16 February for four days of liberty. There, Bear Ace family members joined the ship for the four day "Tiger Cruise" back to Norfolk.

On 9 March, VAW-124 returned to it's own USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) for a week long Air Wing CQ period. The remainder of March was spent providing range surveillance for a VF-84 MISSILEX as well as preparing for a three week detachment to NAS Fallon, Nevada where the Bear Aces provided strike support and improved our ability to operate in an overland environment while accomplishing a 73.1% FMC sortie completion rate.

On 8 May, the Bear Aces returned aboard the USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) for REFTRA in the Puerto Rico OPAREA. Once again, the ship pulled into FT. Lauderdale for four days and more Bear Ace family members were able to experience Navy life first-hand. We closed out the month with an Air Wing MISSILEX on 24 May.

The Bear Aces provided aerial coverage for Camp David, Maryland during the Summit meetings between President Bush and Soviet President Gorbachev on 2 June. Two days later, VAW-124 provided support for the sea trials of USS NORMANDY (CG-60).

VAW-124 left Norfolk on 20 June for Advanced Phase aboard the USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71). This Advanced Phase was marked by the first visit by a U. S. Navy ship in fifteen years to the country of Trinidad and Tobago. After returning home on 28 July, the Bear Aces continued training in the local area. A VAW-124 detachment was sent to Brunswick, Maine to provide Aegis support in late August and mid September for USS CHOSINS (CG-65) and USS COWPENS (CG-63).

Workups continued with FLEETEX in October and November where the USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) and USS AMERICA (CV-66) operated jointly in the Puerto Rico OPAREA. A highlight was a combined CVW-8/CVW-1 MISSILEX in which 30 air-to-air missiles were expended. The Bear Aces returned to Norfolk on 19 November in preparation for what appeared to be an uncertain deployment.

On 3 December, VAW-124 sent an advance detachment to Bahrain to provide badly needed AEW coverage in the Northern Arabian Gulf in support of Operation Desert Shield. On 28 December, the Bear Aces deployed with CVW-8 aboard USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) for what eventually became Operation Desert Storm.
