1993 COMMAND HISTORY UPDATE

The start of a new year found the Bear Aces of VAW-124 continuing operations aboard USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT with the Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force (SPMAGTF). In February the Bear Aces successfully completed their advanced phase training and were ready for deployment begining 11 March. On 25 March, after turning over with VAW-126/USS JOHN F. KENNEDY, they began flying in support of Operation Provide Promise and Maritime Guard. In the early morning hours of 26 March, Bear Ace 603 and her crew were lost at sea. The Bears rebounded from this tragedy and continued their crucial mission in support of United Nations sanctions. On 12 April, Operation Deny Flight was added to their tasking. In all operations the Bears' precision and expertise were essential to the United Nations' effort to avoid further destruction and loss of life in the besieged country of Bosnia-Herczegovenia (B-H).

Relief from the tedious employment in the Adriatic came on 25 May.

Practice Strikes at Avogonisi range were followed by a transit to Rhodes,

Greece for a port call from 28 May through 1 June. On 4 June, the Bears were again scrutinizing the skies, watching for violators of the No-Fly Zone over B-H, while also supporting the much needed supply drops to needy areas in country.

On 26 June, USS ROOSEVELT and CVW-8 were sent to fill a gap in the CENTCOM AOR. After transiting the Suez Canal, VAW-124 began flying missions from the Red Sea in support of Operation Southern Watch. Here, their quick reaction time and ability to flex to changing threats and environments were put to the test. The Bears performed flawlessly in the face of adversity and

their stamina saw them through another 45 days without a portcall. In mid-July, the Bears headed back into the Mediterranean Sea, bound for Naples. After 9 days in port, they returned to the Adriatic and on 30 July they resumed their duties over B-H.

On 7 August, the Bears stopped briefly in Corfu, Greece then returned to the Adriatic for ten more days of Operations Deny Flight and Provide Promise. Turnover with the America Battle Group was completed on 25 August, and the Bear Aces headed home after a truly arduous deployment marked by top-notch performance in both the Adriatic and Red Seas.

The Bears arrived in Norfolk on 8 September, and after a 30 day standdown, they were again responding to operational commitments. On 23 September they flew in support of a missile exercise in the Vacapes OpArea and soon after sent a detachment to Eglin AFB for a high visibility missile exercise. On 20 October, they performed CQ aboard USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT and participated in an airpower demonstration for the Dependents' Day Cruise. In early November the Bears participated in FFARP with VF-84, and from 8 to 15 December they flew Orange Air sorties against the USS SARATOGA/(CVW-17) Battlegroup.
