1. Command Composition and Organization:

A. Mission: The USS Barry is equipped with the most advanced naval weapons system in the world. AEGIS, a computerized, quick reaction air defense system, provides extraordinary capabilities against attacking aircraft and missiles. The heart of the AEGIS system is the SPY radar which automatically detects and tracks virtually everything that is flying out to 200 miles.

Barry's Vertical Launching System (VLS) can launch both the land attack Tomahawk cruise missile and the Standard surface-to-air missile. One forward five-inch gun mount can be used against threatening ships or to bombard shore targets.

Barry also has the most advanced underwater surveillance system available today. Our suite of antisubmarine warfare (ASW) equipment consists of a hull mounted sonar, acoustic array sonar, and a helicopter data link which can receive information on the location of submarines and surface ships miles away.

Barry is propelled by powerful gas turbine engines allowing her to cruise at over 30 knots. Overall she is a diverse and extremely capable warship.

3. Narrative: March was a big month for Barry. The entire month was geared toward Barry's Final Evaluation Period (FEP) and having CDS 26, Commodore Cox, on board. Tremendous strides were made on topside preservation and attention to detail while preparing for FEP. The group PT program and clampdown were put on hold allow extra time to prepare. Barry got underway on 23MAR99 for TSTA 3 to practice our FEP scenario. Instead of pulling into port that night as planned, we stayed out one more night to specifically work on the GQ portion of the scenario. 3. Narrative: April was a great month for underway training on BARRY. The five ships of Destroyer Squadron 26 conducted an eighteen day group sail from Norfolk, VA to the Puerto Rican Operational Area. All five DESRON 26 ships, USS Mahan, USS Laboon, USS Kauffman, USS Samuel B. Roberts, and USS Barry, got underway for the group sail on April 6, 1999 (Encl. 1). The first few days of the underway were spent doing CMTQ for the squadron's ships. Afterwards, COMDESRON 26 stated that BARRY had the most successful CMTQ in the squadron.

Over the entire group sail BARRY did four underway replenishments. We received fuel on all four, and offloaded five inch ammunition on the one with the USS Seattle. We had flight quarters twice, once to transfer the CMTQ team aboard and once to conduct a medical evacuation to Portsmouth Naval Hospital (Encl. 2 and 3). BARRY also conducted small boat transfers to shift personnel from ship to ship. We did several small arms, five inch and CIWS (Close In Weapons System) exercises, including PAC (Pre-action calibration) fires, drogue shoots, fire for effect exercises, and the killer tomato exercise.

BARRY scheduled several social events for fun during the group sail. We had a bingo night and an ice cream social. We also had a BARRY sports day. Events included a homemade kite flying contest, a fender toss, a tug of war, skeet shooting, damage control events, and naval trivia. The operations department won for the day and earned a departmental day off.

BARRY conducted a port visit to Sint Maarten, N.A. from April 15th to the 19th. This liberty port provided a great break for the crew. The captain made an official visit to the Lt. Governor of Sint Maarten, N.A. The local Navy League hosted a reception for the wardroom and chief petty officer's mess for BARRY and the USS Ramage on April 16th.

BARRY returned to home port on April 23, 1999, and began a six week availability (FMAV).

3. Narrative:

The majority of May was spent on BARRY's Fleet Maintenance Availability (FMAV) which included several major projects and installations. Topside BARRY completed a very intensive topside preservation effort. In addition a ship's force rehab of all berthing heads was conducted.

BARRY received several new upgrades for the Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer's Division. A new Sonar Insituational Mode Assessment System (SIMAS), also known as the 25B-V1 or UYQ-65, was installed. This system provides range predictions and optimal sonar modes and settings to the sonar technicians (STG's). A System Level Recorder (SLR) was installed which provides the ability to record what the

sonar hears. An audio system was also installed to the SQR-19 TACTical Towed Array Sonar (TACTAS).

The Wireless Internal Communication System (WICS) has taken the place of the HT 1000 walkie-talkies on board. This Commercial Off The Shelf (COTS) system was meant to replace the Navy's DC-WIFCOM radios, a system BARRY never had. Through the use of different talk groups, everyone from the Captain and Department Heads to damage control parties to the different training teams can communicate on a mobile network.

The notable event of the month was the presentation of BARRY's FY '98 Golden Anchor by ADM Reason, CINCLANTFLT. (Encl. 1, 2, & 3)

3. Narrative:

TEAM BAARY started off the month with a one day Dependents Cruise on 04 JUN. A large portion of the crew had friends and family, totaling 227, visit for the short underway making it a great time for the crew and visitors. Some of the events held that day included: USS Typhoon fly by, F/A-18 fly by, SH-3 fly by and photo shoot, 5-inch and CIWS gun shoot, and a steel beach picnic.

The rest of the month was dedicated to training on our Group Sail. For each of the four Tuesday morning to Thursday afternoon underways, BARRY embarked midshipmen for their Cortramid Cruises.

Training and exposing midshipmen to the surface navy was one of the goals during the four weeks. An important part of this group sail was also training watch standers for our upcoming deployment.

Some of the many evolutions conducted this month were: four underway replenishments, one flight quarters totaling 64 evolutions (including night vision goggle launches and recoveries). Maritime Interdiction Operations (MIO) was another focus of training. BARRY conducted three boardings during the group sail, two simulated UN sanctions violators and one simulated drug runner. Combat conducted several War at Sea Exercises and ACTS War Games. The Engineering Department was able to include several BECCES into their watch standing.

Another big push made during this underway was for petty officers to earning their Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist (ESWS) pin. It is now mandatory to have an ESWS pin in order to take the petty officer first class exam.
