2. Commander's Assessment

Just prior to the new year, BLUE Crew turned the ship over to Gold and FREEDOM continued a maintenance availability that lasted until February. During the first off-hull of 2012, BLUE Crew completed all training requirements necessary to retake the hull during the Rapid Refresh period. This Rapid Refresh also marked a shift in the focus of training from THIRD Fleet to the SEVENTH Fleet Area of Operations in support of FREEDOM'S deployment in March 2013. Overall, FREEDOM Blue repeatedly demonstrated the "Fast, Focused, Fearless" nature of the crew to adapt to a number of different situations.

After executing a change of command in May, the crew completed a Type Commander's Material Inspection and Board of Inspection and Survey Special Trials. Both inspections were instrumental in identifying critical material deficiencies that would affect mission readiness. After successful completion of both arduous inspections, the crew shifted focus to carrying out Surface Warfare Mission Package Developmental Testing that culminated in a week-long Quick Reaction Assessment. This assessment integrated core crew, the Maritime Superiority Detachment, and Helicopter Marine Strike Squadron 73. This graduate level exercise demonstrated the full potential of BLUE Crew and the capability of LCS-1 to face various combat scenarios.

FREEDOM BLUE finished the on-hull by taking the ship into a pierside availability that would correct a majority of the issues identified during the aforementioned inspections. During the off-hull, the crew continued to train towards deployment to SEVENTH Fleet, concluding with full rapid refresh certification at the Littoral Combat Ship Training Facility (LTF).

BLUE Crew retook the ship in December, with focus now on the successful completion of various crew certifications, which represented the final hurdle necessary for deployment. Although the certification process for a current warship would take approximately five to six months, BLUE Crew completed nearly all pre-deployment requirements in a matter of weeks, with the remaining requirements scheduled for completion during the off-hull.

2012 afforded BLUE Crew the ability to tackle complex materiel and training requirements with various outside entities providing support and valuable feedback. With our initial deployment to SEVENTH Fleet on the horizon, 2013 looks to be an exciting year for FREEDOM and BLUE Crew.
