## COMMAND HISTORY FOR 1997

Nineteen ninety seven started with the crew enjoying a holiday stand down for Christmas and New Year's until the 5<sup>th</sup> of January. The ship departed on January 8, 1997, for the Middle East Force Exercise Phase II (MEFEX 97-1) in the North East Pacific and San Diego, California. After 13 days of a successful exercise, INGRAHAM returned to Everett on the 21st of January and started the Pre-overseas Movement Period (POM), which provided the crew a chance to spend time with their families and relax until deployment.

The POM period ended on the 18<sup>th</sup> of February, and for the next two days, the ship conducted ready-for-sea underway trials to shake out the cobwebs from the long rest period. On the 21<sup>st</sup> of February, Command George Jeffrey Fullerton and the crew of INGRAHAM departed Everett, for deployment to the Middle East. Enroute to the ship's first stop, Pearl Harbor, the ship completed Middle East Force Exercise Phase III.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> of February, the ship arrived late in the afternoon in Pearl to refuel and pick up last minute deployment supplies. The next day, with the crew's last stop in the United States for the next six months behind them, INGRAHAM departed for the next destination, Guam. The trip to Guam went without incident while INGRAHAM conducted operations with the other ships participating in MEF 97-1, USS PAUL F. FOSTER, HMCS REGINA, and USS FITZGERALD. On the 7<sup>th</sup> of March, INGRAHAM entered the 7<sup>th</sup> Fleet area of operations, and three days later arrived in Guam for a brief stop for fuel, departing that same day. The ship's next destination would be Hong Kong, China.

After a five day transit, INGRAHAM arrived in Hong Kong, for the first liberty port of the deployment. While in Hong Kong, the crew enjoyed the culture of China. Tours were arranged, and the ship's company enjoyed a fantastic stay. After three days in port, INGRAHAM left for Lamut, Malaysia.

Another 5 day transit, found INGRAHAM entering Lamut, Malaysia. The entrance to the harbor is extremely hazardous and shallow, a danger compounded by extremely inaccurate charts. The ship, however, made a safe transit using the ship's RHIB and a fathometer to test the water depth prior to the ship's passage. Unlike Hong Kong, the crew found the city to be less than exciting. On the afternoon of the 26<sup>th</sup>, happy to be leaving, INGRAHAM departed their second liberty port. On March 27<sup>th</sup>, the ship arrived in Phuket, Thailand, for what turned out to be an excellent, if short, port visit. The crew enjoyed themselves by taking every opportunity to see the local sights. May 28<sup>th</sup> brought an end to the port visit and, once again, the ship left enroute to the hot confines of the Persian Gulf. Life in the Fifth Fleet operating area began on the  $3^{rd}$  of April with inchop to Fifth Fleet. On 5 April, INGRAHAM refueled at sea with the USS DETROIT, arriving in Muscat, Oman, the following day. INGRAHAM remained inport for six days. The next task was participation in Joint Exercise Kunjar Hadd 97-2 in the Gulf of Oman. After another refueling at sea on the  $14^{th}$  of April with HMS Bayleaf, the ship began it's trip into the Arabian Gulf proper on the  $17^{th}$  of April, with a transit of the Strait of Hormuz.

Another unrep in the morning of the 18<sup>th</sup> was followed by arrival in Bahrain for turnover and installation of the Navy Mast Mounted Sight. INGRAHAM then left for the northern Arabian Gulf and Maritime Interception Operations (MIO).

Just prior to entering the area of operations, the ship refueled twice arriving late on the afternoon of the 25<sup>th</sup> in Kuwait. Inport for one day, INGRAHAM departed the 27<sup>th</sup> for Eager Sentry 97 in the Northern Arabian Gulf. Eager Sentry ended the 29<sup>th</sup>, and INGRAHAM arrived in Kuwait at 1600 that afternoon to host a reception with the U.S. Ambassador. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May, the ship got underway from Kuwait at 0900, enroute for the Northern Arabian Gulf and Maritime Interception Operations (MIO).

The next day, May 4<sup>th</sup>, INGRAHAM finally arrived in the Northern Arabian Gulf. The next few days were spent conducting ship boardings and diversions. On May 10<sup>th</sup> a significant event in INGRAHAM's history occurred with the arrival of the new Navigator, Lieutenant Junior Grade **Constant**. On the 14<sup>th</sup> of May, the ship once again completed another underway replenishment for fuel and stores. Three days later, the ship left the NAG for Doha, Qatar for a port visit.

The 20<sup>th</sup> of May in Doha marked the half way point of the deployment bringing with it a ship's over-the-hump party. Leaving Doha on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, the last port the ship would see for the next three weeks, we returned to the Northern Arabian Gulf to continue Maritime Interception Operations (MIO). The days brought more unreps with the USS MOUNT HOOD, USNS CIMARRON, and USNS SAN JOSE. These evolutions broke the routine days filled with several boardings and slow watches.

NAG Operations took the ship into the beginning of June. Refueling with the USS CIMARRON several times in the early days of the month, the majority of INGRAHAM's time was spent back in the Maritime Interception Operations areas, just south of Iraq. On the 14<sup>th</sup>, Father's Day away from home, the ship headed for Bahrain. On 17 June, the ship anchored off of Bahrain, entering port on the 18<sup>th</sup>. After six days of exciting liberty on the U.S. Navy Base in Bahrain, the ship left Bahrain to anchor at Bahrain Bell and conduct a Safety Standdown. On the 26<sup>th</sup> of June, the ship got underway from anchor, leaving for the Strait of Hormuz

to conduct CLF escort duty. After completing the successful escort assignment, the ship replenished from USS CIMARRON and returned to anchor off Bahrain Bell. The 1<sup>st</sup> of July found the ship back in Bahrain to remove the Mast Mounted Sight and conduct our turnover for the ship's departure from the Gulf. On Independence Day, INGRAHAM departed to transit back to the United States, chopping into the Seventh Fleet area of operations four days later. On the 11<sup>th</sup>, the ship stopped for several hours in Diego Garcia for fuel and to permit a brief crew visit to the Navy Exchange. Later in the afternoon, the crew set their sights on their first post-Gulf port visit, Fremantle, Australia. The ship arrived in Fremantle for some well deserved liberty on the 19th. Two midshipman embarked on July 20<sup>th</sup> for their Summer Cruise. On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July, the ship departed for Hobart, Australia. During the transit to Hobart, Cart I was completed and preparations made for the upcoming shipyard availability. In Hobart on the 27<sup>th</sup>, INGRAHAM was greeted by a marching band and news reporters. Many memories later on the 31<sup>st</sup> of July, the crew sadly departed Hobart, after an exceptional visit.

The next stop was Pago Pago, American Samoa, for fuel on the  $7^{\rm th}$  of August. Three days later the ship chopped to Third Fleet. On the  $13^{\rm th}$  of August, the ship once gain found itself in U.S. territory at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. On the  $15^{\rm th}$ , INGRAHAM headed for home. The trip back to Everett was eventful due to the arrival of several crewmember's families who were onboard for a Tiger Cruise. Finally on the  $21^{\rm st}$  of August, after six months away, the ship arrived in Everett. The final tally for the deployment:

Completing a post-deployment standdown the 22<sup>nd</sup> of September, the ship moved to Indian Island for ammunition offload. On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, INGRAHAM entered Puget Sound Naval Sound Shipyard for an extensive work package lasting through the 24<sup>th</sup> of November. On the 25<sup>th</sup>, the ship completed sea trials and returned to Everett, ready for the holidays. From the 8<sup>th</sup> of December through the 10<sup>th</sup> of December, INGRAHAM went to sea with the new Prospective Commanding Officer prior to Change of Command. On the 12<sup>th</sup>, Commander George P. Croy, III, USN, relieved Commander George J. Fullerton, USN, as Commanding Officer of USS INGRHAM (FFG-61). The year ended with the crew leaving for a well deserved period of holiday leave with their families.
