
## BASIC NARRATIVE

The first day of 1983 found USS JUNEAU (IPD 10) import San Diego, California, her crew enjoying a holiday leave period. But shortly thereafter, on 3 January, the ship was underway until 7 January for the first week of Refresher Training (RETRA). JUNEAU was underway for REFERA throughout the month of January, pulling back pierside on weekends until 24 January, when she was once again underway in the Southern California Operations Area (SOCAL OPAREA) for READIEX 83-2, firing drones from her flight deck in an exercise with other Pacific Fleet ships.

JUNEAU returned pierside on 29 January and remained there for almost the entire month of February. She was again underway on 28 February for more operations in the SOCAL OPAREA, returning to port 3 March, and remaining there until 10 March. During that time JUNEAU's EMs underwent the Combat Systems Readiness Test (CSRT), with the actual underway material inspection portion of CSRT occurring during a brief underway period of 10-11 March. After two more days in port JUNEAU was again underway 14-15 March for exercises in the SOCAL OPAREA with other ships of COMPHIBRON ONE. She returned pierside 16 March and remained there until 21 March. The week of 22-29 March found JUNEAU participating in Operation KERNAL BLITZ 83-1 off the coast of California.

The remainder of March and the early days of April were spent inport. JUNEAU was underway from 5-8 April for Engineering Casualty Control Examination Training (ECCET) drills, returning to port 9-11 April. JUNEAU then got underway 12 April for the Operational Propulsion Plant Examination (CPPE). This evolution was an outstanding success, as JUNEAU's Engineering Department passed the grueling test in 36 hours, returning to port 14 April, where she remained through 3 May.


On 4 May JUNEAU departed NAVSTA San Diego for her eighth Western Pacific (WESTPAC) deployment. The long transit to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, lasted until 13 May when JUNEAU arrived inport, where she stayed until 15 May. On 16 May JUNEAU was underway for Exercise Operation Bell Volcano (FSCEX) off the island of Kahoolawe, returning to Pearl Harbor 20 May. Two days later, 22 May, she began the long transit to White Beach, Okinawa.

JUNEAU arrived in Okinawa 3 June, where she onloaded Battalion
Landing Team (BLT) 1/7, getting underway the next day for Operation
Valiant Blitz 83, the largest amphibious exercise since World War II.

During the exercise JUNEAU was visited by COMSEVENTHIFIEET, Vice Admiral
J.D. Hogg, who also visited other ships participating in the exercise.

Following the conclusion of Valiant Blitz, JUNEAU was underway for
Hong Kong, B.C.C., on 13 June, arriving in the British Crown Colony
on 17 June. There, the crew and embarked Marines enjoyed maximum
liberty until 22 June, when she was underway for the transit to
Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines.

JUNEAU anchored off Zambales 24 June to participate in a IANTEX, pulling pierwide later that day. The ship then went through a much needed upkeep period, getting underway for Okinawa 12 July and arriving at White Beach 15 July. The next day she was again underway for Numazu, Japan, where she anchored on 19 July. Late that evening the ship set sail for Yokosuka, Japan, where she arrived on 20 July. During the port visit there, Captain J. Hollis Bower, Jr., relieved Captain Lynn P. Blasch as Commanding Officer. The next day JUNEAU was underway for Hakodate, Japan, where she arrived on 30 July. JUNEAU was the first ship to visit Hakodate in two years, and her crewmembers were greeted by both curiosity and adoration from the people of Hakodate. JUNEAU remained in Hakodate until 2 August, when she transitted to Pohang, Korea, where she dropped anchor on 4 August. She participated in Exercise Valiant Usher 83-8K south of Pohang until late evening of 10 August, when she was again upderway for Okinawa.

However, Typhoon Abby was also in the vicinity of Okinawa, thus forcing JUNEAU to seek refuge near Chinhae, Korea. The ship remained at anchor until 16 August, when she began the belated transit to Okinawa, arriving there on 18 August, offloading BLT 2/4 and onloading BLT 2/5 in record time, and once again getting underway that evening enroute to Pohang. JUNEAU arrived in Pohang 21 August, offloaded BLT 2/5, and that evening transitted to Sasebo, Japan, where she remained inport from 22-29 August. JUNEAU again set sail for Pohang on 30 August, arriving there on 31 August, where she stayed overnight.

The ship got underway for Subic Bay on 1 September, but two days later was re-routed to Okinawa, wher she arrived on 4 September and remained until 9 September. On 10 September JUNEAU got underway for Subic Bay, arriving in the Subic OPAREA on 12 September. She dropped anchor in Subic Bay on 14 September, pulling pierside that same day. JUNEAU remained inport until 27 September. On 28 September the ship again began transit to Okinawa, arriving at White Beach on 30 September and getting underway that evening for the transit to Guam. JUNEAU was inport Guam overnight 4 October, getting underway the next morning for the long trip to Pearl Harbor.

JUNEAU arrived in Pearl Harbor 14 October and remained there until the afternoon of 16 October, when she set sail for San Diego, where she arrived 23 October, beginning a month-long post-deployment leave and upkeep period.

JUNEAU remained at Pier 6 until 28 November, when she got underway for the SOCAL OPAREA. On 2 December the ship moored at Broadway Pier in downtown San Diego for a Visit Ship Weekend. Along with visits by the general public, a group of recruits from the San Diego Recruit Training Command, as well as a ceremony by the Pearl Harbor Survivors Associatio—(with COMNAVSURFPAC, Vice Admiral Harry C. Schrader as guest speaker) highlighted the weekend. On 5 December JUNEAU travelled down San Diego Bey where she moored at Pier 11 at the Naval Station. She remained there for the rest of 1983 as the crew enjoyed its normal holiday leave pariod.
