- 2. Mission. The mission of the Osprey Class Mine Hunters is to complement the MCM 1 Avenger Class Ships in littoral waters, harbors, and bays. The Osprey will detect, classify, and neutralize all known and projected types of influence and contact mines. It will provide navigational assistance to other MCM units in conjunction with coordinated operations with airborne and other mine countermeasures forces. Secondary missions include route surveys, channel conditioning, underwater search and rescue, and the collection of hydrographic/oceanographic data.

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3. <u>Narrative</u>. As the first ship of the class, and the primary test platform for the entire class, Osprey spent a great part of the past year preparing for and participating in tests and trials. Her ability to "do a 360 on the dime turn" is very impressive. Engineering plant problems have prevented Osprey from achieving a successful full power run, and have contributed to significant scheduling delays in completing the Operational Propulsion Plant Examination.

On a brighter note, Osprey was the official starter ship for the widely publicized BOC around the world sailboat race which began on 17 September 1994 in Charleston, SC. This hugely successful endeavor promoted a very positive image of the Osprey and the Navy to the public.
