

USS PONCE (LPD 15) Historical Narrative

The year 2001 began on a sad note for PONCE. In early January, PONCE lost one of her dearest crewmembers. LT Corrine J. Pellegrin, gifted Supply Officer and mother of four, passed away suddenly from complications due to a heart attack. A memorial service was held on 10 January. She would truly be missed.

Preparing for a deployment and in the middle of workups, there was little time to grieve. The crew had to focus on training and readiness. Following a Fast Cruise and Final Evaluation Problem, PONCE was underway on 22 January for Group Sail with the USS KEARSARGE and USS CARTER HALL. This exercise including an outstanding port visit to St. Thomas, Virgin Islands.

Following a brief stop in Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico to offload NCW Assets, PONCE arrived in Morehead City, NC on 06 February. Here she onloaded MSSG-24 for Marine Expeditionary Unit Exercise. MEUEX provided an opportunity for the KEARSARGE ARG to flex their operational and C4I capabilities under the direction of COMPHIBRON SIX.

On 15 February, after Fueling at Sea with the USNS SUPPLY, PONCE returned to Norfolk. A three-week FMAV period began the following day, and the crew labored to complete its final preparations for deployment.

The next underway came all too soon, and PONCE headed back to Morehead City on 08 March. MSSG-24 re-embarked in less than a day, and she transited to Mayport, Florida. From 11-13 February, the ARG participated in an Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection Exercise directed by COMSECONDFLT. All three ships dealt with swimmer attacks, bomb threats, and small boat approaches. PONCE received high praises for her crew's attention to detail and quick response to potential threats.

On 14 March, the ARG was underway for Joint Task Force Exercise with the Enterprise Battle Group. JTFEX brought PONCE into the roughest seas she would experience all year. Heavy rolls reaching up to 36 degrees led to the cancellation of many events and postponement of the E-4 exam. SACEX and SOCEX were completed prior to offloading MSSG-24 in Morehead City on 27 March.

The following day, PONCE anchored at Lynnhaven anchorage for a Friends and Family Day Cruise. Friends and loved ones arrived in the well deck via LCU, and were shown true Proud Lion hospitality. The day's events included

numerous static displays, flight deck and man overboard rescue evolutions, and an LCAC fly-by. Nothing was more appreciated than the eagerly awaited transit back to Norfolk, where the first POM leave period would commence.

From 28 March to 20 April, PONCE continued its Preparation for Overseas Movement. Working parties moved stores, food, and ammunition below decks. Sailors attended married and single pre-deployment briefs. Time was becoming a precious commodity and each spare moment was spent with family and friends.

Second leave period ended on 20 April and the entire crew returned for a Fast Cruise. Watchbills for each steaming condition were double-checked. General Quarters and Man Overboard drills were called away. The Engineering plant was lit off. Soon PONCE would be ready to leave.

The morning of 25 April brought rain and fog. Teary goodbyes became hurried and a crew dressed in whites quickly changed back into coveralls. The CO ordered all lines taken in, and PONCE was underway for her fifteenth Mediterranean Deployment. After re-embarking MSSG-24, she began her arduous transit across the Atlantic.

On 09 May, the ARG anchored of the coast of Rota, Spain, and began a two-day turnover process with the BATAAN ARG. Meteorology, Cryptologic, and Naval Special Warfare Detachments embarked. Following a brief transit, PONCE arrived in Tangier, Morocco, for a four-day port visit.

Bi-lateral Exercise MED SHARK took place from 16-20 May with the Royal Moroccan Navy and Marines. PONCE was conducting split-ARG operations at this time, but used the opportunity to deploy embarked assets for training. EDATF drills, live fire training, mass casualty exercises, rehearsal and assault were followed by wash down and backload.

PONCE proceeded into Gaeta, Italy, after a Replenishment at Sea with the USNS SIRIUS. On 25 May, sailors and Marines visited Exodus House, a drug rehabilitation center for men and women. COMSIXTHFLT joined the volunteers for an evening of dining, dancing, and socializing.

On 29 May, PONCE began the transit across the Adriatic Sea through the Straits of Messina to arrive at Dubrovnik, Croatia on 01 June. Sailors participated in a Community Relations project on 03 June, scraping and painting a fence at Osnova Primary School.

Following the brief port visit, PONCE got underway 05 June and crossed the Aegean Sea. She headed through the Dardanelles and Bosporus Straights to anchor in the

vicinity of Poti, Georgia on 10 June. Under the operational control of COMNAVSOUTH, PONCE took part in Exercise COOPERATIVE PARTNER from 11-22 June. The exercise included eight countries and more than 30 ships of NATO and Partnership for Peace nations. Events ranged from Amphibious Cross-Training and Maritime Interoperability Training to a Public Demonstration and Amphibious Landing. As CTF 903, PONCE hosted Distinguished Visitor Day on 22 JUN. The entire exercise was a complete success.

From 22 Jun to 02 July, PONCE steamed the route to Brindisi, Italy, for a three-day port visit. The Fourth of July was celebrated with a "Let Freedom Ring" ceremony. On 05 July, she was underway again, this time for Albanian PHIBLEX. PONCE rendezvoused with Albanian ships to conduct ENCOUNTEREX and VBSS exercises.

The next stop for PONCE was Valetta, Malta, from 23-26 July. On the final day, sailors visited the Jesus of Nazareth Institute, where they sanded, primed and painted the orphanage's entire playground. At the same time, embarked Marines chipped and painted an immense trellis and a number of doors at the Urseline Crech Orphanage.

On 27 June, the ship transited to Rijeka, Croatia for a 12-day Intermediate Maintenance Availability with the EMORY S LAND. During this time, the crew conducted Command Indoctrination, Commander's Assessment of Readiness and Training (CART I) and a CIWS Assist Visit. On 10 August, sailors from PONCE and EMORY S LAND refurbished a large fence and several classrooms at Kindergarten Belvedere. More good times followed as the volunteers played the home team of Basketball Club Kantrida. A reception at the clubhouse followed.

Back at sea, PONCE refueled and resupplied with USNS LEROY GRUMMAN and USNS SIRIUS. She visited Palma de Mallorca, Spain from 17-20 August. Here, volunteers scraped, spackled, and painted the kitchen and dining room at Servi de Acolidla, a shelter for abused women and their children. Two pallets of Project Handclasp toys and clothing were also donated.

A brief transit brought the ship to Tarragona, Spain on 22 August for four days. During this time, MSSG-24 and the BLT departed for operations in Kosovo.

PONCE got underway again on 27 August, and arrived two days later in Catania, Italy. The next port visit was 3-6 September in Limassol, Cyprus. Here PONCE sailors painted offices and hallways at Limassol Foundation St. Stefanos, a home for mentally challenged adults.

From 6-22 September, PONCE transited to Rota, Spain for turnover with the BATAAN ARG. The deployment was winding down, and preparations for homecoming were in progress. She conducted several Replenishment at Sea evolutions, a CIWS PACFIRE and TDU shoot, and re-embarked MSSG-24 and the BLT in the vicinity of Sigonella, Italy.

In Rota, the washdown process began and equipment was offloaded. Meteorology, Cryptologic, and NSW assets debarked. CTF 61 visited on 26 September to congratulate PONCE for a job well done.

On 01 October, PONCE was headed home. Since the events of September 11, the crew was especially eager to return to friends and love ones. Following a customs inspection and offload in Morehead City, they arrived to open arms in Norfolk on 15 October.

Post-deployment leave and stand down was a much-needed break for the crew. The cruise had been outstanding, with three major exercises and 13 port visits. But the nation had changed in PONCE's absence, and there was much work to be done regarding Anti-Terrorism and Force Protection.

On 05 December, the ship got underway for Naval Weapons Station Yorktown, Virginia, to offload ammunition. This was followed by a brief training period in the VACAPES OpArea. She returned to port on 11 December.

As the year came to a close, it was time to say goodbye to one of PONCE's finest. LCDR Wayne R. Brown relieved LCDR Larry J. A. Felder as Executive Officer on 13 December. The crew bade him a fond farewell at PONCE's annual Christmas party that evening.

Holiday leave and upkeep commenced 14 December, and there was nothing left to do but look back with pride on a job well done. PONCE's dedication and teamwork during 2001 would reward her with the Safety Pennant, the Health Promotions Award, the Golden Anchor, and the prestigious Battle E.
