PART I. COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

Time Period: January - March 1987

Mission: Deployed to Forces, U.S. Sixth Fleet, Mediterranean.
Operational Control: Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces Europe (CINCUSNAVEUR).

Time Period: March - December 1987

Mission: REFIT, Interim Deployment Phase
Operational Control: COMNAVSURFLANT (Immediate Senior in Command: Commander, Destroyer Squadron SIX).

Commanding Officer, CDR B. L. Lewis, USN.

Permanent Duty Station/Homeport: Charleston, South Carolina.

Aircraft Assigned: One Light Airborne Multi-Purpose System (LAMPS) MK III, SH-60, Seahawk Helicopter from HSL-42, Detachment 7, (PROUD WARRIOR 431), Mayport, Florida at various times throughout the year.

COMMANDING OFFICER'S BIOGRAPHY

Commander Billy L. Lewis was born in [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. After enlisting in the Naval Reserve in June 1963, he entered the U.S. Naval Academy in 1965, graduating in 1969 with a Bachelor of Science Degree.

Commander Lewis was initially assigned to USS DEHAVEN (DD-727) as Damage Control Assistant, a tour which included two deployments to Southeast Asia. Following Vietnamese Language and advisor training 1971, he joined U.S. Naval Forces Vietnam in April, 1972 and served as an advisor at Vietnamese Naval Headquarters in Saigon, Republic of Vietnam. Following graduation from U.S. Naval Destroyer School in August 1973, Commander Lewis served two years as Engineer Officer and one year as Weapons Officer in USS TALBOT (FFG-4).

In March, 1977, Commander Lewis reported for duty as Commanding Officer USS TAKELMA (ATF-113) and completed two deployments with U.S. Seventh Fleet prior to assignment to the Naval Postgraduate School in June 1979. He was graduated in December 1980 with a Master of Science Degree in Management. In March 1981, Commander Lewis joined the commissioning crew of USS JACK WILLIAMS (FFG-24) as Executive Officer. Following this sea tour, Commander Lewis was assigned duty as a Manpower Analyst at Center of Naval Analyses for six months prior to reporting to duty as a Program Analyst in the Officer of General Planning and Programming (OP-90). Commander Lewis was ordered to duty as Commanding Officer USS ROBERT G. BRADLEY (FFG-49) in December 1985.

Commander Lewis' personal decorations include the Navy Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal with Gold Stars in Lieu of Second and Third Awards and the Navy Achievement Medal.

Commander Lewis is married to the former [REDACTED] of [REDACTED]. They have three children -- [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

MAY:

Objective: Complete a successful Atlantic Underwater Testing and Evaluation Center (AUTEK) Anti-Submarine Warfare Evaluation.

Results:

- Conducted Basic Anti-Submarine Warfare exercises with USS CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI (SSN-705) on the AUTEK range.
- Successful Qualification included two MK 46 torpedo firings; one from the ship and the other from embarked helicopter.
- Debarked PROUD WARRIOR 431 during transit to homeport, Charleston, South Carolina.

JUNE:

Objective: Conduct Midshipman training in support of LANTRAMID I and II.

Results:

- Embarked Midshipmen for LANTRAMID phase I. Training consisted of inport and underway periods utilizing the Fleet Training Unit, Charleston 20B5 Combat System Team Trainer (CSTT) and Combined At-Sea Training (CAST) in company with USS CARR (FFG-32), USS JOHN RODGERS (DD-983) and USS JOHN HANCOCK (DD-981).
- Embarked second group of Midshipmen for LANTRAMID phase II which included helicopter qualifications for SH-3 Sea King, SH-60 Sea Hawk helicopters and carrier escort duties for USS CORAL SEA (CV-43) in Virginia Capes Operating Area.

JULY

Objective: Conduct Law Enforcement Interdictions off the coast of South America as part of "Operation Checkmate 7".

Results:

- Embarked Coast Guard detachment (LEDET I) at Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico
- Conducted drug enforcement operations off the coast of Colombia, South America in company with USS JOHN L. HALL (FFG-32), USS VOGEL (FF-1047), USS CLAUDE V. RICKETTS (DDG-5), USS LUCE (DDG-38), USNS WACCAMAW (TAO-109). During the operations, ROBERT G. BRADLEY made 7 consensual boardings with no seizures.
- PROUD WARRIOR 431 embarked.

AUGUST:

Objective: Conduct port visit, Kingston, Jamaica, return to homeport, Charleston, South Carolina for Selected Restricted Availability (SRA).

PART III. NARRATIVE

JANUARY:

Objective: Continue Mediterranean Deployment (Med 2-86) under the operational control of Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces Europe (CINCUSNAVEUR).

Results:

- Completed Intermediate Maintenance Availability, Gaeta, Italy, with USS PUGET SOUND (AD-38).
- Operation "Quarterback Sneak", real world Anti-Submarine Warfare operations with USS LUCE (DDG-38) and USS MCCANDLESS (FF-1084).
- Participated in National Week War Games with USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CV-67) and USS NIMITZ (CVN-68) Battle Groups.
- Prepared for CINCLANTFLT Propulsion Examining Board, Operational Propulsion Plant Examination (OUTCHOP OPPE) by conducting a Charleston Gas Turbine Engineering Mobile Training Team Assist visit.
- HSL-42, Detachment 7 (PROUD WARRIOR 431) embarked.

FEBRUARY:

Objective: Complete Mediterranean Deployment (Med 2-86) under CINCUSNAVEUR OPCON.

Results:

- Conducted "blue water turnover" prior to outchop with USS DOYLE (FFG-39).
- Embarked CINCLANTFLT PEB and conducted the outchop OPPE. Results were "satisfactory: below average," necessitating a reduced cycle evaluation.
- PROUD WARRIOR 431 embarked.

MARCH:

Objective: Arrive, homeport, Charleston, South Carolina for post deployment leave and upkeep.

Results:

- Commenced thirty day post deployment leave and upkeep period.
- PROUD WARRIOR 431 debarked.

APRIL:

Objective: Conducted missile exercise, North Puerto Rican Operating Area.

Results:

- Two standard SM-1 medium range missiles were fired against target drones. Both shots were successful with target drones evaluated as destroyed.
- Received Anti-Air Warfare Certification.
- PROUD WARRIOR 431 embarked.

Results:

- Visited Kingston, Jamaica to commemorate the twenty-fifth anniversary of Jamaican independence. In addition, ROBERT G. BRADLEY hosted a number of other functions such as a ship's party for 50 orphans from the Port Royal Boys Home, a reception for Jamaica's Governor General to commemorate Jamaican independence which included 200 guests from the diplomatic corps and a reception to honor officers of the HMS GLASGOW and the Jamaican Defense Force.

- Debarked PROUD WARRIOR 431 while enroute, homeport, Charleston, South Carolina.

- Arrived Charleston, South Carolina and off-loaded weapons at Charleston, Naval Weapons Station.

- Commenced SRA and Intermediate Maintenance Availability (IMAV), in which significant hull, propulsion and combat systems work packages were completed.

- Installed SHIPALT 103K High Speed Rotor/Brushless Generators on all four Ship's Service Diesel Generators.

SEPTEMBER:

Objective: Continue SRA and IMAV. Begin preparations for Interim Refresher Training (IRFT), Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

- Conducted ordnance alteration, Combat Systems Alignment on all Fire Control Systems and Search Radars.

- Conducted 20B5 CSTT by Fleet Training Unit, Detachment Charleston.

- Completed IMAV.

OCTOBER:

Objective: Complete SRA; continue preparations for IRFT, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Results:

- Completed SRA as scheduled.

- Conducted Training Readiness Evaluations (TRE) and Engineering Mobile Training Team (EMTT) visit.

- Conducted COMNAVSURFLANT Combat Systems Mobile Training Team, (CSTT) visit, Phase I.

- Conducted Supply Management Inspection (SMI) and Planned Maintenance Schedule (PMS) Assist visits.

- Completed Sea Trials successfully.

- On-loaded weapons at Charleston, Naval Weapons Station.

NOVEMBER:

Objective: Conduct Interim Refresher Training (IRFT), Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Results:

- Complete Departure Material Status Review (DMSR).

- Commenced IRFT with emphasis on Engineering, Damage Control, Combat Systems and Seamanship evolutions.

DECEMBER:

Objective: Successfully complete IRFT, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and the CINCLANTFLT PEB Operational Propulsion Plant Examination (OPPE).

Results:

- Embarked CINCLANTFLT PEB in Mayport, Florida to conduct OPPE during transit to Charleston, South Carolina. Completion resulted in a adjective grade of "Satisfactory: above average."
- Inport, Homeport, Charleston, South Carolina. Commenced holiday leave and upkeep.
- Changed operational control to Commander Second Fleet.
