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## 2. Commander's Assessment

From 01Jan07 through 05Apr07, USS ROBERT G. BRADLEY (FFG 49) conducted a Counter Narco-Terrorism Operations (CNT Ops) deployment and contributed to the

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capture and transfer of over 20 tons of contraband. The ship successfully completed a mid-deployment Unit Level Training-Sustainment (ULTRA-S) assessment en route from Key West, Florida to homeport for a Continuous Maintenance Availability (CMAV). Following the mid-deployment CMAV, the ship returned to CNT Ops in the Eastern Pacific.

After the post-deployment leave and upkeep period, ROBERT G. BRADLEY conducted a visit from the Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV). The ship was found fit for sustained combat operations. ROBERT G. BRADLEY then trained for her second ULTRA-S and the completion of her first SHIPTRAIN FRTP (Fleet Response Training Plan). As this was the second ULTRA-S conducted, the assessment went smoothly due to the level of knowledge gained in preparations for the previous assessment as well the hard work and determination of ROBERT G. BRADLEY's crew.

Throughout the summer and early fall, ROBERT G. BRADLEY took part in several fleet training exercises to help prepare both the USS HARRY S. TRUMAN Carrier Strike Group and the USS WASP Expeditionary Strike Group for their upcoming deployments. As the year came to a close, CDR James P. Cody turned over command of ROBERT G. BRADLEY to CDR Clinton A. Carroll at Nauticus National Maritime Center in Norfolk, Virginia. Upon return to Mayport, ROBERT G. BRADLEY entered into an Extended Selective Restricted Availability (ESRA) to include the replacement of all four ship's service diesel generators and the installation of reverse osmosis distillation units.
